Decarbonisation: Early start of measures for projects in Bremen and Eisenhüttenstadt

Bremen/ Eisenhüttenstadt, 11 August 2023 - The German Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Climate Protection has granted an early start of measures to ArcelorMittal's DRIBE² project for low-carbon steel production in Bremen and Eisenhüttenstadt.

As part of the transformation project, low-CO₂ steel is to be produced in Bremen and Eisenhüttenstadt with the help of sponge iron (Direct Reduced Iron - DRI), which will initially be produced in Bremen in a DRI plant using green hydrogen.

The early start of the measures enables - at the company's own risk - the award of supplier contracts and studies even before the granting of the funding commitment by the European Commission. ArcelorMittal had submitted an application for funding for the approximately 2.5 billion euros investment project to the Brussels authority in 2021. The Federal Republic of Germany and the Free Hanseatic City of Bremen intend to provide all the public funding for the DRIBE² project as soon as the funding commitment has been received from Brussels.

"The early start of the measures we have applied for sends an important signal: ArcelorMittal is ready to go down the path of decarbonisation. We are now taking concrete next steps at our plants in Bremen and Eisenhüttenstadt to prepare for the construction of the new plants, as much as is possible while we await a funding approval decision from the European Commission. This will support us in achieving the change in production methods - which requires a complete change in technology. Once all the permits are in place and the conditions are right, we can prepare the next stage and hopefully move swiftly into implementation," comments Reiner Blaschek, CEO ArcelorMittal Germany and Chairman of the Management Boards at both plants.
